Victor McLaglen contributes a striking characterization as the smiling villain and should be in great demand by big concerns for big roles; he deserve it. Lillian Rich and Robert Frazer create a likeable heroine and hero respectively. David Torrence and the remaining cast furnish good support. However illogical they may be, the picture abounds in melodic punches that are stirring and will hold the audience in suspense.
