## BRITISH GIRLS

GRANTS SAY 8,000 HAVE COME UNDER EMPIRE SETTLE-MENT SCHEME

EDMONTON, June 23.-Since June, 1923, approximately 8,000 women immigrants have come to Canada under the Empire Settlement scheme, to engage in household service, and of this number eighty per cent have made good, says Miss M. V. Burnham, of Ottawa, supervisor of the women's branch of Department of Immigration, Ottawa. Miss Burnham has been making tour of western Canada, inspecting facilities for the accommodation of women immigrants, looking into the requirements of the country for next spring, and conferring with members of the immigration staff.

Winnipeg, Regina, and Calgary have their government hotels for the temporary accommodation of these newcomers. In Edmonton they are put up at the Y.W.C.A. and Rosary Hall, placed in positions by the employment services, and supervised by Ernest Wilson of the immigration department. Miss Burnham is going into the records of those who have been placed and sizing up the requirements for next spring. up the requirements for next spring. She consults with authorities in each province, gets an estimate of their requirements, then tries to fill this

In addition to the women coming under the Empire settlement scheme, there are many coming out able to give service to rural communi- ling. ties. The office has had many applications from all over the dominion, in numerous cases, from people who wish to bring out relatives to work on farms under the reduced rate.

The result is very satisfactory on the whole, but it means a great deal of supervision. The dominion government DINNER GI is responsible for the after care of the immigrants coming out under the Empire Settlement scheme. Records of each case are kept and individual attention is given to all problem cases. Each large centre has women investigating officers to look after these. The department has also placed conductresses on all trains to look after women, children and young girls travelling
