

the Last Day for Filing Returns of Income Earned During the Calendar Year 1926

The increased rebates provided at the recent Session of re Legislature in respect of married persons and dependents may be claimed for this period. The rebates now in effect are as follows :-

Married persons, also widows and widowers with dependent children. (Where a husband and wife each have a separate income, an aggregate rebate on \$1,800, shall be apportioned between them). . . \$1,800.00 Single persons, and widows and widowers without dependent children \$1,200.00 Each dependent \$300.00 Insurance Premiums paid but not exceeding \$500.00 Non-resident persons (only) \$1,000.00 Assessors will make the necessary corrections on returns where rebates, as revised, have not been claimed. An individual whose income does not exceed \$900.00 is

not required to file a return except upon demand of the Returns should be made promptly in order to avoid incuring penalties.

The necessary forms and full information may be obtained upon application to any Provincial Assessor or to the Commissioner of Income Tax, Victoria.

TUNE BY-ELECTION IN NORTH OKAN-AGAN WILL DRAW LEADERS OF BOTH SIDES

VICTORIA, March 31 .- With the first est of public opinion on provincial affairs in two years scheduled to take place in North Okanagan in June. British Columbia political parties will soon be on the march again.

Following Premier Oliver's announcement in Ottawa that the North Okanagan poll would be held some time in June, both the major parties will begin preparations for the struggle during the next few weeks. After the Premier's return here during the next week or so the date of the poll will be defin-North Okanagan are arranging for the ROTARY CLUB nomination of a candidate who will seek to recapture the seat for the gov-

With W. F. Kennedy of Vernon already in the field as Conservative nominee, there is a general expectation among politicians that Dr. K. C. Mac-Donald, who held the North Okanagan seat from 1916 to 1924, will come out again as Liberal standard bearer. Dr. MacDonald is the best-known public man in the riding, and is regarded as strong candidate. Following the 1924 election he was taken into the cabinet as provincial secretary, but was defeated George Rorie and W. S. Fisher. in the subsequent by-election by the late A. O. Cochrane, who died on D. C. Patterson. December 4 last,
