Magistrates Vote Against Use Of Lash in British Penal System

LONDON (CP)—More than 500 magistrates from all parts of the United Kingdom have voted against re-introduction of the lash as a form of punishment for crimes involving acts of violence.

The decision was taken on a motion urging the annual meeting of the Magistrates' Association to call for repeal of legislation which in 1948 abolished the power of the courts to impose sentence of whipping.

Viscount Templewood, chairman of the association and author of several reference works on the subject, said increased crime was not something exclusively confined to Britain.

But the resolution was described as "barbarous" by Charles Royle, Socialist member of parliament for Salford.

THINK DIFFERENTLY "The young people have the same views as any other Canadians," he said.

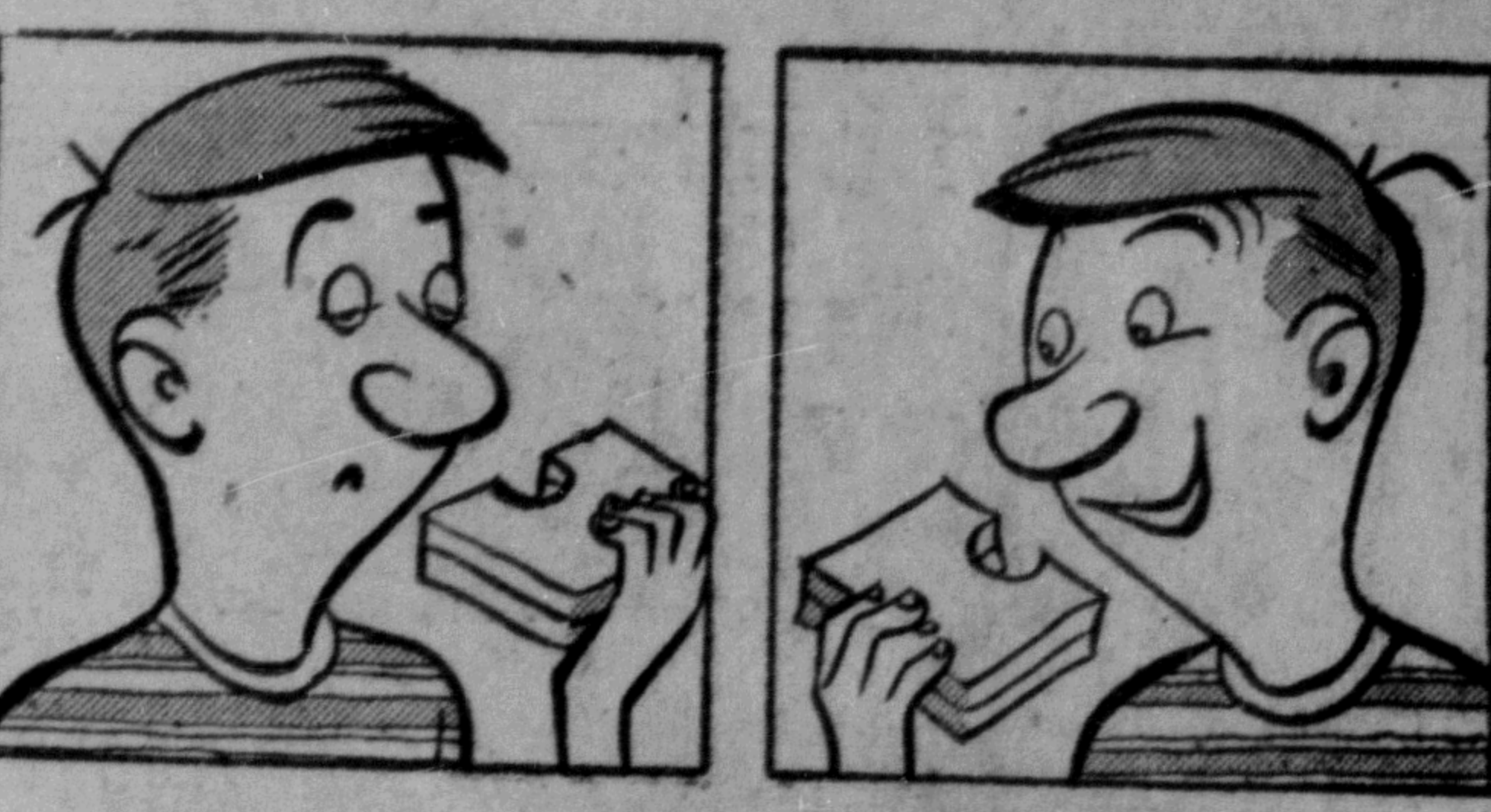
Sien explained that the discrimination met by the first Chinese in B.C. was the origin of the desire to "go home" in death. They would return to their homeland when they had enough money to live there comfortably or at least return to die.

Some never did get enough money, he said, but these still wanted their bodies to be buried in their native villages.

In the 1930s the Benevolent Association and the Ming Yung Association started a scheme to remove all the bones of elder Chinese to the Far East. Thousands were shipped at \$16 to \$18 per set. The last shipment went in 1937.

Then came the Japanese War, the Second World War, the Civil War and now the Korean War. The bones remain on this side of the Pacific.
