MAJOR MACLAREN ON NEW AIR CLUB SCHEME

Urges Victoria People to Establish Centre and be Ready for Move

VICTORIA, Nov. 12.—Now is the time for Victoria to develop an airport, Major D. R. MacLaren of the Dominion Airways declared here after he and representatives of the Vancouver City Council had interviewed Hon. T. D. Pattullo, minister of lands, on plans for a new air port at Vancouver.

"While Vancouver is preparing to establish an aviation centre, Victoria should move also in order to be ready for the big development in aviation which is bound to occur in the next few years," Major MacLaren said.

"While Vancouver must provide a more elaborate airport to care for both land and water machines, the problem in Victoria is much more simple. Here only water machines must be provided for Victoria, being on an island, is essentially a place for water machines, as there is no place for land machines to fly to. In Vancouver, however, we must provide for both."

NEAR THE CITY

"The time to make provision for aviation is now, as it is highly desirable that your airport be placed near the city. In a few more years land may not be available for the purpose in Vancouver and that is why we are moving at this time."

Alderman Almond, Alderman Woodside and City Solicitor J. B. Williams represented Vancouver at the conference with Mr. Pattullo. Spanish Banks, just outside the city, was suggested as a suitable site for an airport and will be investigated further by the Vancouver authorities, at Mr. Pattullo's suggestion. GAMEKEEPER SHOT BY POACHERS ON ENGLISH ESTATE

LONDON, Nov. 12.—In an affray with alleged poachers on the estate of Lord Temple, of Newton Park, gamekeeper William Walker, aged 34, received shot wounds in the stomach that killed him on the spot.

Lately there have been serious deprivations of coverts on Lord Temple's estate by poachers, and Walker, with a young under-gamekeeper named George Rawlings, set out to try and catch the offenders. Shots were heard by the watchers indicating that poachers were at work, and Walker, who had been standing behind a tree, called out, "I've got you now," but as he spoke a shot rang out and he fell mortally wounded. As he fell he shouted to Rawlings, "Shoot them!"

Rawlings states that he was without cartridges and all he could do was to run to raise an alarm.

Boats returning during the week from the Vancouver Island chum fishing have included the seiner Dicky Boy, owned and skippered by Peter Leighton of Metlakatla; the Overtime, Capt. Roy Lanningdahl, and Azurite, Capt. Ole Skog.

Tied up to a boom near the Edward Lipsett wharf, a small trolling boat keeled over and sank in the rising tide on Thursday afternoon. The vessel was raised the next day and taken away for repairs.

With but three days to go before the close season commences and November 21 regarded as the final day upon which there is any possibility of halibut being offered for sale, the total landings of the season up to yesterday stood at 24,233.40 pounds as compared with 25,449.800 pounds on the similar date last year. American bottoms so far this year have landed a total of 18,998,850 pounds as compared with 19,128,700 pounds last year. Canadian landings stand at 6,246,600 as against 6,321,100 pounds.

The past week with landings totalling 323,000 pounds, of which 238,500 pounds has been American and 84,500 pounds Canadian, has been light but regular, the highest landings in a single day being 84,000 pounds on Wednesday.

Prices have been at a fairly good level ranging from 14c and 6c on Friday to 17c and 6c on Saturday for American fish, while Canadian bids have fluctuated from 12c and 6c on Saturday to 17c and 6c, the same day. The highest price for American fish was paid the Addington for 13,900 pounds while the Kaien, 1,500 pounds; Pair of Jacks, 1,500 pounds, and Gibson 3,000 pounds, received the top Canadian prices.

The Jack Cook fleet is being kept busy these days. On Wednesday, the "Joy Bird" took five tons of coal to Kitkatia for the Indian Department. The "Lella" is back after a five-day charter to take the inspector of mines to Klutze Inlet. Harold Jefferson has been appointed skipper of the Lella.

Jack, who recently branched out into the taxi game, it may be recalled was the pioneer in the taxi business in this city, having operated the old hack some twelve years ago, later inaugurating the first car for hire in Prince Rupert.
