READS LIKE FICTION BUT WAS NOT THAT TO MAN WHO FACED GRIZZLY

EDMONTON, May 11 .- A special despatch to the Journal says: Fighting off for three days, a grizzly bear which had taken possession of his camp, while he himself was delirious from the pain of a .44 Colt revolver ullet in the left lung, was the experience of Morris Pacquette, a trapper of the Lhard river district.

Pacquette was found by his partner, Morris Worth, three days after the ac-i cidental shooting. Worth shot the bear, made the wounded man comfortable. and later, Pacquette was able to leave, for Hudson Hope, en route to the nearest doctor at Pouce Coupe.

The story Pacquette told to his partner, reads like a "wild and wooly" fiction yarn-only it happens to be true.

EVENT AT SPRING MEETING OF **O.J.C.-RICH STEEPLE-**CHASES

TORONTO, May 11.-(Canadian Press) -One of the finest fields of thoroughbreds ever raised in the Province of Ontario will race in the 68th renewal of the King's Plate, historic feature of the Spring meet of the Ontario Jockey Club at Woodbine. Park. The race as usual is run on opening day, which this year is May 21. The King's Plate is the oldest fixture on the continent and one of the most popular and the substantial increase in value-there is \$15,000 added this year-makes the race of even greater interest to owners and turfgoers.

Seven or eight among the 40 nominees appear to share popular approval. J. P. White's Listerine filly by Rockville, Miss Jean, earned bracelets four times as a two-year old.
