Mrs. Keen doubted to show her good hand and Mr. Champion considered his hand better suited for a spade contract. His two spade bid was promptly doubled by Mr. Dale.

The queen of diamonds was opened and there was no way for Mr. Champion to avoid the loss of three spades, a heart, two diamonds and a club for a 500 point set.

Mr. Champion's remarks concerning his partner's bidding were not complimentary. Piously, Mrs. Rhule called attention to the fact that she had six points and that the books say you can't pass your partner's opening bid with that much strength.

"I thought you would surely bid one of the other suits on the second round," she added, in a voice which implied Mr. Champion had grossly erred in not doing so.

"I don't care how many points you had," said Mr. Champion, angrily, "you didn't have any bid."
 "You mean you think I should pass?" asked Mrs. Rhule.

"I know it," replied Mr. Champion, modestly. "Don't ever bid to no trump when you're blank in my suit."

Mr. Champion was right. When you keep the bidding open for your partner, hoping he'll bid a suit you will like better, it's amazing how often he will rebid in the same suit...
