

FOUR INDIANS DEAD ON NAAS

Were Poisoned on Eating Fish Eggs From Granite Pail Near Arrandale

Eating of stale salmon eggs has caused the death of four Indians in the vicinity of Arrandale on the Naas River and two others are in a precarious condition according to reports reaching the city this morn-

An old woman had the fish eggs in a granite pail and it was from this that the Indians ate. They soon sickened with the result stated. The incident occurred three days

The dead are Bob Lincoln, Mrs. Edward Robinson, Mrs. Walter Haldane and an old woman, all of Arrandale.

It is the usual method of the Indians to leave the fish eggs in a stream till they wash white, then burying them in the ground. In this case the use of the granits pail kept the poison in with fatal results.

The tragedy is being investigated by the Indian department and Kincolith doctors are making analyses.
