PATTULLO IS REMINISCENT

Tells of Going to Yukon Just Thirty Years Ago This Fall

VICTORIA, Nov. 22.—Hon. T. D. Pattullo became reminiscent when he recalled that it was just thirty years ago that he, a comparatively young man, formed one of a party of eighteen who entered the Yukon for the purpose of establishing government over the territory representative of the Dominion of Canada.

Of the party who then went into the gold country there were only two remaining, Mr. Pattullo and J. D. McGregor, of Brandon, Man.

Mr. Pattullo recalls the day very vividly. He had come from Eastern Canada, and with his companions charged with the establishment of settled government in the territory made the trip down the Yukon River to the site of Dawson. The trip was made through floating ice in the river, and as he put it, "Eliza in Uncle Tom's Cabin had nothing on us in the matter of navigating the River Yukon."

The thermometer stood at eighteen degrees below zero, as they made the landing at the site of the capital of the Yukon. There were ice jams in the River Yukon, and the situation was anything but inviting to a young man from the East.

The present Minister of Lands, however, spent quite a number of years in that territory in various capacities before taking up his residence in Prince Rupert, and later assuming the important position which he has occupied for eleven years.

new banks. Perhaps, that accounted for the decrease in catch.

T. H. Johnson spoke briefly on behalf of the dealers. As far as fishing methods were concerned, he thought that was something the fishermen themselves were more familiar with. He felt that, if something were not done, the Pacific Coast halibut banks would soon be depleted. Then there would be nothing for either fishermen or dealers. Chicken halibut were not desirable commercially and he would welcome some regulation whereby their marketing would be prohibited. He was also in favor of the extension of the close season two weeks at each end. The close season had already proven a market and price stabilizer.

The standing votes on various questions were then taken by Mr. Found. All favored the continuation of the close season as at present and there were only two or three who voted against its two weeks' extension at each end. The question as to those who favored the closing of chicken banks did not take very well so another was carried favoring the protection of baby chickens. Quite a few voted in favor of the prohibition of all but the larger hooks.

The telegraphic reports this morning show heavy snow at Portland Canal points. At eight this morning 30 inches of new snow was reported at Stewart, 36 inches at Anyox and heavy snow at Alice Arm. Along the Skeena four inches was reported at Haysport, Terrace and Port Simpson report rain. Following is the detailed report as supplied by the Government Telegraphs:
