HAD MAJORITY OF ONLY ONE IN LEGISLATURE BUT NEVER IN DANGER

WINNIPEG, June 16 .- (By Canadian Press).-Electors of Manitoba will go to the polls on June 28 to determine the composition of the eighteenth legislature of the province and incidentally pass upon the record of the Bracken Progressive administration which has been in power for the past five years.

Devoid of any outstanding political issues the campaign has resolved itself into straight party appeals for the confidence of the electors with government candidates asserting that defeat of the Bracken government will bring about group system of government or coalition of two or more minority parties.

At dissolution the government supporters numbered twenty-eight in house of fifty-five members, a majority of one over all. Progressive control of the legislature, however, has at no time been endangered during the five years of the government's tenure in offic and on every important division the Progressives have been sustained substantial majorities.
