



A revival in the lumber and timbering industry of the lower Skeena sections is in prospect after a desultory demand of several years that has sent several mills to the scrap heap and receiver. Prospects at present are bright for all mills along the railway and at Terrace preparations are under way for an active year. Timbers make up the bulk

At Terrace the George Little mill has on hand two good orders for this maof 40-foot boom sticks to be used in rafting by big pulp mills in Eastern Canada. Another order may reach half a million feet of cedar timbers for culvert work on the Canadian National Railways to be delivered at Obed, Alberta. For the handling of these order as well as others expected in addition t his general business along the railway n this district, Mr. Little left last week for Edmonton to purchase a carload of horses for use in the bush and hauling K. GORDON, PRESIDENT, AND J. B. logs to the mill.

The pole industry has also stiffened a little and prospects are good for a big year in this material. Last year 'the absence of snow proved a handicap and Terrace Board of Trade, elected at the many poles were left in the bush. # SYNOPSIS OF

PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects condiional upon residence, occapation, .nd improvement for agricultural

Full information concerning reguations regarding pre-emptions is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge ty addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Gov-

ernment Agent. Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Com missioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be BULL HARBOR .- Rain, southwest received.

PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stumpage.

HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

LEASES For grazing and industrial pur-

poses areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company. GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partly free, permits are available for settlers. campers and travellers, up to tes
