Edmonton Paper Sees Increase in Amount Shipped to Pacific

Gratification is being freely expressed by Vancouver newspapers over the fact that the Wheat Pool is to build a large rminal elevator at that port this year, as that implies a large increase in the export of wheat through Vancouver next winter and in season following.

Edmonton may also find cause for encouragement in the announcement. Of the wheat which goes out through Vancouver, the greater part goes there by way of Edmonton. This city is so situated that it must be the great collecting centre for grain from the western prairie country which goes to the Pa-

Railways radiate from Edmonton into the great wheat belt, south, east and north, like spokes from the hub of a wheel, while the easy grades on the National through Jasper Pass make the handling of the traffic to the ocean ter-

The Wheat Pool recently took under lease one of the large elevators at Vancouver, and has also the elevator Prince Rupert under lease. Next season it will have three of these large terminals on the Pacific through which to pour grain from Alberta and western Saskatchewan.

Rentals and interest charges on these elevators can only be paid by sending grain through them. The inference is that the Pool expects to ship twice or three times as much grain westward next winter as it shipped last.
