ORIENTAL GRIP IS INCREASING

Chinese and Japanese Form 11.56 Per Cent of B.C. Industrial Population

VICTORIA, Aug. 18.—Asiatics are increasing their grip on British Columbia industries, according to a survey conducted by the provincial government. From 11.30 per cent of the total industrial population in 1925, Orientals increased to 11.56% last year. With the total number of industrial workers in the province increasing rapidly, the fact that the Orientals more than held their own during the period under review is regarded as all the more significant. According to the government figures, 1,395 Orientals were added to the employment registers of the province last year.

The figures disclose that Canadians and people of British origin represent 70.2 per cent of the industrial population; natives of Continental Europe 15.62 per cent and people of other countries 1.9 per cent.

FOUR C.P.R. LINERS TO BE HERE DURING SPACE OF TWO DAYS

Within the next two days four C.P.R. coast liners will arrive in Prince Rupert with a large group of tourist passengers on board. Until repairs at the provincial government wharf are completed in a month or six weeks' time, vessels of this line will dock at No. 1 Shed, G.T.P. Wharf.

Tomorrow morning at 7 o'clock, the steamer Princess Louise, Capt. Arthur Slater, is due from Vancouver. She will sail about 9 o'clock for Alaska.

The Princess Alice, Capt. Cliff, making a special trip to Alaska with members of the National Real Estate Board of the United States, will arrive at 7 o'clock Saturday morning from the north, sailing at 11 for Vancouver.
