ALASKAN CANNERY MAKES GOOD PACK

KETCHIKAN, Aug. 26.—A pack of 55,000 cases of salmon was made by the Pacific American Fisheries plant at Ek-curson Inlet, according to Superintendent A. N. Herrold. The run of pinks and the packs of the variety by the canneries in that district prove that it is being restored to the standard of former years, in Mr. Herrold's opinion.
The pink pack of the season which has just ended was almost as large as that of 1926, he pointed out. It was about twice as big as the 1925 pack and the latter season was the cycle year for the current season. There is no question that the pink run is being built up by the restrictive measure adopted by the U.S. bureau of fisheries, Mr. Herrold said. The shortage of the 1927 pack from that of 1926 was mainly in chums and reds.
