



## WOULD HAVE WOMEN HELP WITH TARIFF

When Household Commodities are Under Consideration

TORONTO, April 11. — (Canadian Press).—That an auxiliary board of two or three women be appointed to discuss customs imposition when commodities for household use are being considered, or that one woman be appointed to the tariff and taxation advisory board was the substance of a petition passed by the Toronto Women's Liberal Association at the meeting recently. Mrs. Walter Creswick gave her report on tariff investigation and recommended that the petition be served to the prime minister. That the Toronto Women's Liberal Association backs Colonel Mitchell in seeing that the New York Daily Mirror should be forced to retain a certain standard if it is going to be circulated in Canada was one of the suggestions brought up at the meeting and referred to the executive for further discussion as to the step the association would take.

A petition is about to be presented to the board of governors of Toronto University requesting them to establish a four-year course leading to a degree in physical education. Mrs. A. C. MacNaughton pointed out in her educational report that the boys and girls in the high schools throughout the country require skilled leadership in matters of physical education.

In speaking of the study of French in the schools, Mrs. MacNaughton said: "I cannot see that knowledge of the native tongue of Sir Wilfred Laurier and Hon. Ernest Lapointe could have an injurious effect upon my children."

## BOTTLE FROM SHIP DRIFTS ON ZAYAS

Its Return to United States Consul is Compiled With by Ben Bolivar

Ben Bolivar, who is working with Geo. Kerr at the Zayas Island sheep ranch picked up on the beach on March 16, a bottle containing a message dropped overboard from the American steamer El Segunda. The note, which was signed by H. W. Heuer, third mate of the steamer, had been written on August 29, 1926, while the ship was in 51 degrees, 20 minutes north latitude and 131 degrees 32 minutes west longitude, and simply asked that the finder please forward to the nearest American consul. The bottle and message was turned over today to American Consul, E. A. Wakefield.

The location given in the message would be in the Pacific Ocean west of the north end of Vancouver Island, about 300 miles from here.

### LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

### PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects conditional upon residence, occupation, and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 6,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including
