ENDURANCE REACHES LIMIT

Combination Being Formed by Diplomatie Means to Offset Communists

unless the Russian regime changes, which is exceeding unlikely."

This is the forecast of Frank H. Simonds, noted war correspondent and authority on international affairs, who, in the July issue of the Review of Reviews, views the severance of relations between Britain and Russia, following the government raid upon the Soviet House in London, as a most significant link in a series of antagonistic moves which may involve all Europe in a war between Russian nationalism and the British empire.

UNDER COVER WARFARE

In point of fact, he declares, a state of under-cover warfare exists between the two powers today, with Russia inciting anti-British uprisings in China and elsewhere, while actual military aggression on the part of the British government is checked only by the empire's economic unfitness for war and the warweariness of its people.

Nevertheless, he says, "it is not possible to mistake the fact that British endurance has reached the limit" as evidenced by the diplomatic break.

"Russian hostility to Britain has been expressed in a number of operations both within and without the British Empire, which has been not only expensive but even disastrous," he says. "In China, these Russian operations have fallen little short of actual war. Nor has there been any real concealment of the fact that the Soviets are carrying on a campaign against Britain all over the world, with the open design to promote

"Turkey in 1922 was an admirable instrument for this purpose, China is today even better, India may tomorrow serve the same purpose. Peace with Russia is impossible because those who rule Russia base their power upon the principle of the overthrow of capitalism; and even temporary compromise is out of the question, because the Russians believe that British misfortunes and difficulties 1 d out the promise of suc-
