**GETTING READY TOURIST SEASON**

C.N.R. ORDERS NEW ROLLING STOCK TO MEET INCREASED DEMANDS IN 1927.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 8.—Orders for additional equipment to cope with the summer season of heavy passenger travel have been placed by the Canadian National Railways. One order includes 20 sleeping cars of the type which contains twelve sections and one drawing room, five compartment observation cars, containing four compartments and six sections and twelve diners of the standard type in use on the railway. The compartment observation cars are intended for western and transcontinental service and will contain built-in radio equipment. In these all steel cars, the wires will be conduit with outlets in the open observation end and provision for two headlamps in each compartment. The receiving apparatus will be placed in convenient position and so designed as to occupy less space than the present standard cabinets which are in use on all important trains. The loud



**CIVIC COURT OF REVISION SITS**

Is Adjourned Until Monday—All Cases Deferred Till Then

The court of revision on the civic assessment roll, consisting of Mayor Newton (chairman), Ald. Jos. Greer, Ald. M. M. Stephens, Ald. W. J. Greer, and Ald. Oscar Larsen, held a session in the city hall this morning at 10 o'clock and considered the appeals made by the various parties against the assessment.

W. E. Fisher and George Smith were present and argued that the assessment of their properties was too high. The other appeals were also considered but no decisions will be announced until the next sitting of the court on Monday morning next when R. R. Nichol, taxation commissioner of the C.N.R., will be present to argue the claims of the railway for reductions.

City Assessor J. C. McLennan was present to defend the assessment as being fair and equitable.

**LOCAL HALLS ARE ORDERED TO HAVE IMPROVED EXITS**

**SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS**

**PRE-EMPTIONS**

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by subjects of other countries who become British subjects conditional upon residence, occupation, and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e. carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made in printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emption must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

For more detailed information see the Bulletin "How to Pre-empt Land."

**PURCHASE**

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$25 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment of stumpage.

**HOMESITE LEASES**

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

**LEASES**

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.

**GRAZING**

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partly free, permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.
