A BYLAW TO CONFIRM AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT AND THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY.
AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that Edward F. Jones, Esq., has been appointed Returning Officer to take charge of the said vote.

BYLAW NO.
A BYLAW TO CONFIRM AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT AND THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY.

WHEREAS it is proposed that an agreement shall be entered into between the City of Prince Rupert and the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company, which agreement shall be in the words and figures following:
MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made in duplicate this . . . day of . . . in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-seven.

BETWEEN:
CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT, hereinafter called "THE CITY" OF THE FIRST PART,
and
THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY, hereinafter called "THE RAILWAY COMPANY" OF THE SECOND PART.

WHEREAS differences have arisen regarding the taxation by the City of the lands belonging to the Railway Company situated within the limits of the City of Prince Rupert, and certain other matters as hereinafter appearing, and this agreement is made for the purpose of settling such differences.

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that in consideration of the covenants and agreements on the part of the several parties herein contained, the parties hereto have agreed with each other as follows:
1. The Railway Company will pay to the City annually, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Municipal Act and any City Bylaw or Bylaws affecting the payment of taxes in each year for and during the period in the succeeding clause mentioned by way of taxation (subject, however, to the credit terms and stipulations hereinafter set out) a total fixed sum of sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) in respect of all the lands owned, leased, occupied or otherwise by the Railway Company within the City limits, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the lands of the Railway Company situated in the said City which at the date of this agreement are under lease or occupied other than by the Railway Company shall be assessable and taxable by the City during the life of this agreement.

2. The City agrees with the Railway Company to accept the sum of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) per annum together with the Local Improvement taxes mentioned in Clause Three (3) hereof in lieu of all Municipal taxes, rates and assessments of every kind whatsoever to be levied by the City against the Railway Company (except as herein otherwise provided for) in respect of the lands of the Railway Company and all buildings, structures or other improvements thereon or therein, and all the personal property of the Railway Company within the City limits, for a period of five years from the 1st day of January, A.D. 1927.

3. The Railway Company agrees to pay all Local Improvement taxes which may hereafter be lawfully imposed during the lifetime of this agreement on the lands of the Railway Company in the City of Prince Rupert.

4. All the Railway Company's lands in the said City hereafter during the said five year period, alienated by sale or lease or otherwise than by the Railway Company (except the following described lands being the Railway Company's lands used in connection with the operation of its Dry Dock Plant:
"ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land, and land covered with water situate on the bay of the Harbour of Prince Rupert in front of Water Lot, Block "G" and being part of said Block "G" in the City of Prince Rupert, County of Prince Rupert and Province of British Columbia, which may be more particularly described as follows:
Beginning at a point distant from the westerly corner of Lot 45 in Block 4, Section 7 (as shown on Plan No. 923 of the Townsite of Prince Rupert, registered in the Land Registry Office at Prince Rupert, B.C., of 1914) at 244.91 feet to a post known as "Post No. 175 of Prince Rupert Townsite"; thence S. 33 deg. 30' W. 403.94 feet to said point of beginning; thence S. 25 deg. 13' W. 340.71 feet, thence 108.36 feet along a curve to the right of a radius of 268.31 feet, described from a point which lies in a line drawn at right angles from the last described course and from its southwestern extremity; thence S. 59 deg. 27' W. 859.71 feet, thence S. 78 deg. 57' W. 856.01 feet, thence No. 39 deg. 33' W. 358.46 feet, thence S. 30 deg. 27' W. 52.0 feet, thence No. 30 deg. 27' W. 848.16 feet to the established harbour headline for Prince Rupert harbour, thence along Harbour Headline No. 53 deg. 46' 01" E. 1912.08 feet, thence S. 39 deg. 39' E. 1046.26 feet to the point of beginning as shown outlined in red on blue print plan attached and signed as relative thereto and containing an area of 35.78 acres more or less, together with those portions of waterfront Block "G" above high water mark, according to plan of record in said Land Registry Office as N. 923, Sections 6 and 7, which lie within the boundaries above described and also all piers, wharves, landing stages and other like sectional drydocks appertaining thereto and used therewith shall become taxable at the fixed assessment period following the date of alienation, sale or occupation in the manner provided for in Section 217 of Chapter 179 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1924, and the Railway Company will notify the City immediately on entering into any agreement or arrangement for such alienation, sale or occupation of the date and fact of same. Provided, however, that the transfer, by sale or otherwise, of the Railway Company's lands to the Canadian National Railway or to any constituent Company embraced in said system or to any subsidiary thereof, shall not be considered an alienation within the meaning of this paragraph.

5. The Railway Company shall annually receive from the City as a credit on account of the said sum of sixty-five

Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) from the taxes collected on any Railway lands so alienated, sold, or occupied otherwise than by the Railway Company a sum of money computed on the basis of the revised assessments for the year 1927 at the mill rate for the year in which such credit is due.
6. The Railway Company shall continuously operate or cause to be operated continuously in a reasonable manner its Dry Dock Plant, situated in the City of Prince Rupert, during the five year period above mentioned, such continuous operation to be interpreted to mean operation for at least nine (9) months in each and every year during the life of this agreement, and if the Railway Company fails to so operate or cause to be operated the said Dry Dock Plant (unless prevented from so doing by strikes or causes over which the Railway Company has no control) then and in that event the said Dry Dock property, more particularly described in clause Four (4) hereof, shall become taxable at the next assessment period following the said failure to so operate the said Plant.
7. For the purpose of this agreement the property used in connection with the Dry Dock and more particularly described in Clause Four (4) shall be deemed to be the property of the Railway Company.
8. It is understood and agreed that nothing in this agreement contained shall be construed to affect the City's right to impose water, power, light and telephone rates or rentals, trades license fees or any other rates or assessments not chargeable on land or personal property.
9. The Railway Company will at the request of the City grant, such easements over its property within the City limits as may be necessary for sewers, water mains, gas mains, electric light, telegraph wires, telephone wires, or other similar civil utilities; subject always to the approval of the Railway Company's Engineer, whose opinion in all cases must be treated as final, without prejudice to the right (if any) which the City may by bylaw possess to appropriate an easement for any of the above purposes.
10. This agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto.
AND WHEREAS it is desirable to pass a Bylaw ratifying and confirming the said recited agreement, so that the same may be submitted for the approval of the ratepayers of the City of Prince Rupert, pursuant to the Statutes of British Columbia, and being section 218 of Chapter 179 of the Revised Statutes of 1924,
NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The said herebefore recited Agreement is hereby confirmed and ratified in every particular and shall be deemed to have taken effect from the 1st day of January, A.D. 1927.
2. This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY TAXATION EXEMPTION AGREEMENT BYLAW."
3. This Bylaw shall not come into force and effect until the same has been submitted to and approved of by the electors of the municipality who are entitled to vote on bylaws to contract a debt, and the agreement shall have been duly executed by the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Prince Rupert and by the proper officers of the company duly authorized thereto.
