Before the discussion opened, Mr. Shaw explained a great difficulty as

"Now the condition on which broadcasting is conducted in this country," he said, "is that nothing of a controversial nature must be spoken from the platform or anywhere else except by members of the government. How any animated, possibly embittered, controversy is to be carried on this evening without either of the speakers becoming controversial I cannot tell you.

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

PRE-EMPTIONS

Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, condi-and improvement for agricultural

> Full information concerning regugiven in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made acres, before a Crown Grant can be For more detailed information see

the Bulletin "How to Pre-empt PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grasing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and lease of Crown Lands." Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres.

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts 25c to 85c and the range administered under a grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given I,mperial Valley grape fruit, 3 for 25c to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partly free, permits are available for settlers.
