

TORONTO, Feb. 24 .- In spite of the enormous demands being made upon its timber resources and a fire menace which has destroyed many millions acres of valuable forest land. Ontario leads the world in timber wealth. Hon. William Finlayson, minister of lands and forests, told the Ontario Legislature Friday night in moving the second reading of his forestry bill. The bill is aimed at further increasing this wealth and at

rehabilitating the forest lands. "We hope, by a new policy," said the minister, "to perpetuate the timber wealth of this province."
