

Anti-Evolutionists to Carry on Fight in Several of United

OKLAHOMA CITY, Dec. 6. - The world's Christian Pundamentals Association is preparing for a bitter fight against the teaching of the Darwinian theory of evolution in Oklahoma, Kansas and Arkansas, according to Dr. W. H. Riley, president of the association. The organization will address itself in the campaign to the states' legislatures and the voters.

"These three states will be the centre of the next attack on the teaching of evolution in the public schools and colleges," Riley declared, "and I am utterly convinced that we will win our demands, although church leaders and educational heads in most instances are against us."

Ample financial backing already assured for the fight, Riley said, and added: "An overwhelming majority of the church people of Oklahoma aiready are in favor of an anti-evolution law. but the 'Liberals' hold the offices, while university and college leaders throughout the country are almost as a unit in opposing the fundamentalists."

In Oklahoma and Kansas, he sain. the campaign will be addressed to the legislature, while in Arkansas a referendum to the people will be sought.
