## GLOBE TROTTER GAVE LECTURE

CAPT. H. M. SEATON OF SMITHERS SPOKE LAST NIGHT UNDER AUSPICES OF KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Capt. Henry Massey Seaton, Smithers rancher and erstwhile globe trotter, gave an interesting lecture last night under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus before a good-sized audience on his experiences on a trip around the world during which he worked his way. The gathering was presided over by Father P. J. McGrath.

At the age of 61, Capt. Seaton, an ex-Imperial soldier set out on foot from New York for his globe circuit, having a set of Indian clubs as his sole travelling equipment. Arriving at San Francisco, he worked his way across the Pacific Ocean and finally reached Australia where he received a warm welcome, his fame having gone before him, and raised sufficient funds by lecturing to proceed to Japan, China, Northern Asia and Europe.

One of the interesting experiences he recounted was in Tibet when he was captured and bound by natives, being held captive for three weeks until he escaped by clubbing his guard. Again in Northern Burma he was pursued for six weeks through wild country having no provisions other than what he could hunt being unable to cook that for the feared lighting a fire. Finally he reached Northern India in an emaciated condition and met friendly British soldiers who attended to his wants and saw him in good shape to continue his travels. Finally reaching Bohemia, he was once again captured, this time by a lady who made the rest of the journey with him as his wife. He completed his journey at New York.

Capt. Seaton, who spent the week-end in the city, returned to Smithers on this morning's train.

## PATRICIAN CREW WON SAIL RACE HANDILY

Conditions Not Favorable to Good Sailing in Event Saturday Afternoon

Under conditions which were hardly suitable for good sailing, the wind being not adequate, although the day was fine, H.M.C.S. Patrician won handily from the local detachment of the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve in the sailing race over a six-mile triangular course in the harbor Saturday afternoon. The time of the Patrician boat, which was sailed by Lieut. Lay, was 3 hours 26 minutes and 13 seconds, while the R.C.N.V.R. crew under Paymaster Lieutenant H. H. Ryall, made the distance in 3 hours 49 minutes and 23 seconds. The Patrician received a time allowance of six minutes on account of difference in sailing area.
