New Sewing Skills For Beginners

For beginners in home sewing, the first sewing lessons can often make a world of difference between future success or failure.

Most women first start to sew with their mothers on the family sewing machine. But, not until she gets her own machine, does the average woman take her sewing seriously.

After years of experience with the problems of beginners in home sewing, some sewing centres have evolved a new beginners' course called "Sewing Skills." It is planned to teach beginners what they want to learn most, right from the start—the skill to sew in a way that does not look homemade. The course of six lessons is given free to purchasers of a new sewing machine. It can be taken any time within a year after purchase.

One of the most important steps in sewing with professional finish is learning how to handle the machine. This is the first lesson in the course. Victory Was Guaranteed But Muzzy Muffed It

Here is another illustration of the case where the responder has a choice of bids and where the responder makes his decision through judgment rather than "book-learning."

Mr. Masters had three possible bids after his partner opened the bidding with one club. These were "three clubs," "two no-trump" and "one spade."

Mr. Masters considered "three clubs" as the worst of the lot, because it is vague, because it shuts out several rounds of bidding and it reduces the chance of getting into a four spade contract.

He decided against two no-trump because, while he had the necessary strength (about the equal of an opening bid), he lacked good intermediate cards.

"One spade" was the final (and best) choice—a waiting bid, which left the way open for any final contract, depending on the nature of partner's rebid.

Against the final contract of three no-trump, Mr. Champion led the jack of hearts which was won by the king in dummy.

After looking the hand over briefly, Mr. Muzzy pulled a club from the board and finessed the ten, losing to the lone queen. Since he needed at least two club tricks, he now had no chance for his contract.

Mr. Muzzy's first round club finesse was not just bad luck. It was an error. He had a play available which would guarantee him two club tricks no matter how the adverse clubs were divided. And since he had ample protection in the other three suits, it was by no means necessary for him to win the first two clubs. He could win ANY two club tricks.

His play was to lead a club and go up with the ace. This would protect against any club break including all five in either opponent's hand. Take the worst possible break, for example—all five in Mr. Abel's hand. The ace would win the first trick. A small club to the jack would knock out the queen. The next club would come from the board, toward Mr. Muzzy's 10, and Mr. Abel could win with his king or not. There would be no way for him to prevent the 10 from winning ultimately.
