## Reindeer Herds Planned for Northern Newfoundland Coast

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—A big-antlered, hardy animal which easterners know only as a picture on a Christmas card may soon be roaming the wind-swept barrens of Labrador.

A local group planning to introduce reindeer to Newfoundland's northern dependency visualize herds running into the thousands as raw material for a profitable industry in hides and meat.

An earlier attempt to get the species started in Newfoundland ran afoul of poachers. Dr. Wilfred Grenfell, medical pioneer on the ice-jammed north coast, brought a herd of 250 domesticated reindeer from Lapland in 1908.

The herd found the terrain and food supplies to its liking and multiplied to 1,200 in four years. But indiscriminate slaughter during the First World War decimated their numbers and the remainder was turned over to the Canadian government.

The area planned for the new attempt is north of Lake Melville and might extend to the extreme limits of population along the coast. Reindeer like sub-arctic climate and vegetation and can survive without any kind of shelter.

### TO BE TAMED

Unlike moose, reindeer will not be treated as game. They'll be a domesticated animal providing meat and hides and the plan is to introduce privately-owned herds which will be expected to support themselves on the near-limitless stretches of summer foliage and reindeer moss on the northern barrens.

The proposal also includes plans for training Labrador Eskimos as herdsmen and giving them a chance to establish herds of their own.

The scheme's backers say well-established markets for reindeer meat already exist in Canada and Great Britain and they look also to the United States market when the foot-and-mouth ban is removed.

## Hobby Yields Collector 47 Scrapbooks

TRURO, N.S. — They call Syd Parker a master clipper and there aren't many who will dispute the claim.

Mr. Parker makes scrapbooks his hobby and every minute of his spare time is spent collecting, tabulating the pasting in the clips.

At the moment he has 47 books—some of them tip the scales at 35 pounds—and five more are in preparation.

They cover all subjects, from people to places and events. He has special books on the Second World War, the Canadian visit of the Queen, then Princess Elizabeth, and newspaper cartoons.

A native of Nine Mile River, N.S., Mr. Parker is an author and poet. He has broadcast his own verse on maritime radio stations and is especially known for his dramatic narrative verse on loggers and logging camps.

## Coarse Fish Palatable; Good for Food

TORONTO — Millions of pounds of fish in Ontario waters are being allowed to die of old age, the department of lands and forests said recently in a bulletin.

Much of this poundage is made up of what are commonly called coarse fish—suckers, alewives, sea lampreys, carp and a small deep-water herring. But the flesh of these fish, the department says, is acutely palatable and can be put to good use as food.

Smelts, a border-line fish, have been marketed successfully during past years. In 1951, the research division of the department found some success selling mullet (sucker) fillets.

## Farmer Resumes Search for Missing Sister on West Coast

CALGARY — District farmer Don L. Cavanaugh, 44, plans to make a fourth trip to the west coast this fall in an effort to clear up the mystery surrounding the disappearance of his sister.

The woman, Mrs. Olive Josephine Law, 42, took the midnight boat from Victoria to Vancouver

June 13, 1951, and was never reported seen again.

Her brother believes she may be a victim of amnesia or foul play. She was carrying about \$2,000 worth of jewelry when she vanished.

Mr. Cavanaugh already has spent eight weeks at the west coast, supplementing police in-

vestigation with his own private probe. He has talked to about 50 friends of his sister—none of whom he ever met before.

As soon as he had harvested his 1952 crop, he started making preparations again to resume his search. He is convinced that his sister is still alive. This time he plans to search for a month.

One ray of hope he will investigate is the report that a Vancouver bus driver believes Mrs. Law used to be a regular passenger on his bus.

Mrs. Law is 5 feet 3 inches tall, slight of build and weighs about 120 pounds. She has steel-gray hair, blue eyes, a burn scar on her right shoulder and a fair complexion.
