Jail Birds at Spokane Prepared Landing Field For Air Derby

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 31. - Lazy usbands aren't nearly so lazy in Spoane since the Spokane air port was awarded the seventh annual national air races, and designated as the terminus for the National Air Derby race from New York, and the Pacific Coast Air Derby race from San Francisco.


