GIRLS ARE NEEDED HOUSEHOLD SERVICE

Suggestion to Train Old Country Young Women for this Country

TORONTO, Sept. 23.—Bride Broder in the Mail & Empire says: All the world knows that the great problem of the farm today is the need of help. And that need is not confined to the man in the field or in the stable. It is felt with even more force by the women in the house. For even if the girls do stay in the country, they are like the town girls, they shy away from domestic service, and it is next to impossible for the mother with the little children to get assistance, even at crucial moments.

Now would it not be possible for some scheme, such as at present exists with regard to boys, be worked with girls? Could not specially hand-picked girls—orphans preferably—girls selected, possibly, under the supervision of the Women's Institute, be brought out here much as boys are now being brought out and trained for household service? Really splendid work is being done along the line of bringing out boys. There is another side to the matter—we are bringing out a good many boys, who, in a few years, will be growing up and wanting wives. What better wives could they have than trained English girls who would have the same point of view about many things and would, therefore, make better mates for them, perhaps, than Canadian-born girls?

CITY RESPONSIBLE FOR WATER SUPPLY

WINDSOR, Ont., Sept. 23.—Damages totalling \$30,000 are sought by William R. Campbell from the Municipality of Kingsville and the Public Utilities Commission of that town for the death of his wife, who died from typhoid during an epidemic there several months ago. Campbell claims he lost his wife owing to careless handling of the town's water supply.
