The ceremony took place at half past three o'clock, the marriage services of the Anglican Church being performed by Archdeacon Heathcote, assisted by the Reverend Harold King.

The decorations in the church had been carried out by a number of the bride's girlhood friends, who had, with the aid of evergreens, ferns and autumn flowers, transformed the interior into a most charming setting for the event. White chrysanthemums were placed on the altar, and the chancel rail was outlined in evergreen and ferns in combination with gold and white flowers, while trailing ivy and bows of white satin ribbon on the pews formed an avenue for the wedding procession.

The bride, who entered the church with her uncle, Dr. Robert C. Boyle, and who was given in marriage by her mother, was attired in a gown of lustrous pearl ivory satin. The bodice, ornamented at the waist with a pearl and lame buckle, was cut surplice, and the long sleeves were finished at the wrist in mousquetaire style, while a graceful side drapery on the skirt featured the uneven hem line. A court train of the satin fell from the shoulders. A close-fitting cap of rare heirloom lace, becomingly arranged over the face, was completed by the long bridal veil of silk net which was embroidered at the four corners with motifs in silver lame, and held in place with French orange buds. She carried a round shower bouquet composed of lily of the valley and golden Ophelia roses veiled with maiden hair fern.

The bride was attended by her sister, Miss Dorothy Somerset, as maid of honor; her cousin, Miss Elizabeth Silbernagel; the groom's sister, Miss Nora Clyne; and Miss Kathleen Kelley of Berkeley, Calif.
