BOARD REVISES TEACHERS' PAY

NEW SALARY SCHEDULE GIVEN
FINAL STAMP OF APPROVAL AT
MEETING YESTERDAY

At a special meeting yesterday afternoon, the school board set its final stamp of approval on a new salary schedule which will have the effect of reducing the salaries of a number of the grade teachers and increasing a few others. The new schedule, providing yearly increases of from \$45 to \$60 for public school teachers and from \$50 to \$75 for those on the staff of the High School according to experience and service, is as follows:

CLAUSES COVERING SALARY SCHEDULE

1. This schedule will be operative as from July 1, 1927.
2. No teacher shall be appointed to the staff with less than two years' successful experience.
3. When a teacher is appointed to the staff previous experience up to eight years may be allowed for at the rate of one year's increment for each two years successful previous experience.
4. All appointments are made to the staff and not to any particular position or school. All teachers are subject to any transfer or change of assignment which the inspector or principals (with the approval of the board) may deem necessary in the interests of the school.
5. In the case of demotion the teacher's salary shall not exceed the maximum of the grade to which he or she has been transferred.
6. The annual increment shall begin or be due one year from date of appointment.

FIRST LEAGUE SOCCER IS TIE

GRAND TERMINALS AND REGIMENT PLAYED TO A ALL DRAW IN GAME LAST EVENING

Playing only nine men and with a score of 4-1 against them at the end of the first half, the Grand Terminals came from behind in the opening game of the league football series last night and divided honors 4 all with the Regiment. The fact that one team was short somewhat marred the play for a while but, on the whole, it was a good hot tussle and the fans in attendance were given their money's worth.

All except one of the eight goals were scored on the upgrade. Russell, Wilson, Ross and Doherty were responsible for the Regiment's counters in the first half with Dickens turning in the only score for the Terminals during that period. In the second half, D. Gurvich, Hamilton and Strachan scored for the Terminals through fast forward work. W. E. Willisroft was referee and F. W. Grimble and A. Clapperton acted as linesmen.

BADLY HURT WHILE LIGHTENING VESSEL

Wesley Stickney Injured Last Night on Stranded M.S. Chialamba

Wesley Stickney, employed by the Prince Rupert Boat House in connection with the work of lightening the American motorship Chialamba which is ashore on White Cliff Island down the coast from here, sustained serious injuries, the principal of which seems to be a badly fractured shoulder, last evening when one of the four-ton oil tanks, being moved from the decks of the vessel, rolled over him. Elias Skog had a narrow escape at the same time but, fortunately, was able to extricate himself.

Word of the accident, which occurred about 7 o'clock, was sent by radio into town and Dr. W. T. Kergin went out on the "28" to meet the Anna S. on which the injured man was rushed to town. The boat arrived about 9:30 and Stickney was immediately placed in hospital where it was reported this afternoon that he was resting easily.

Latest reports as to the situation with regard to the Chialamba are favorable. Work of lightening her is steadily proceeding and it is still expected to float her on Sunday.

PIONEER OF CITY DIED IN HOSPITAL

Late Magnus Morrison Was Native of Glasgow, Scotland, and About 70 Years Old

The death occurred in the Prince Rupert General Hospital about 5 o'clock this morning of Magnus Morrison, an old timer of the city. Deceased, who was about seventy years of age and a native of Glasgow, Scotland, was for some time engaged in sweeping of the city streets. As far as is known, he has no relatives in this country. He has been in the hospital about a month. Funeral arrangements are in the hands of the B.C. Undertakers.

Miss Ralphena Winch, daughter of Dr. H. C. Winch of Hazelton, arrived on the Prince Rupert this morning from Victoria, where she is in training for a nurse in Royal Jubilee Hospital, and proceeded to the interior by train.
