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BIG JUBILEE CELEBRATION

OTTAWA HAS LONG LIST OF EVENTS FOR DOMINION HOLIDAY THIS YEAR

LASTS THREE DAYS

LOT OF OFFICIAL CEREMONIES IN WHICH GOVERNOR GENERAL WILL TAKE PART

OTTAWA, June 24.—The program for the federal celebration of the Jubilee of Confederation during the three days starting with Dominion Day has been completed, and contains features spectacular and in some cases entirely unique—not only so far as the Capital, but so far as the world is concerned. Among the latter features pre-eminent will be the broadcast, internationally, of the musical and speaking program, including the bells of the great new carillon in the Peace Tower.

At 11 a.m. His Excellency the Governor General will lay the corner stone of the new Confederation Block on Wellington Street, and at 11.45 (daylight saving time) His Excellency—by means of an electric button—will give the signal to the carillon for the first playing of the carillon. This will be followed by a fanfare of trumpets, and the carillon will then play "O Canada" and other patriotic tunes. The Prime Minister will then address the gathering. At high noon a royal salute will be fired, bells will be rung, and whistles will be blown throughout the city, clashing in the Jubilee.

At this same hour the Boy Scouts of Ottawa will place wreaths of maple leaves on the graves of Macdougall and Bernard, Fathers of Confederation, in Beechwood Cemetery, and of Laurier, a builder of Confederation, in Notre Dame Cemetery.

PLANT MAPLE TREE

At 12.15 Her Excellency Viscountess Willingdon will, on behalf of the women of Canada, plant a maple tree on Parliament Hill. While the ceremony is proceeding the bands will play the Maple Leaf. The noon ceremony will conclude with the singing of God Save the King by the assembled multitude.

At 2.45 p.m. the official ceremony will be proceeded with. The Ottawa garrison, with Boy Scouts and Girl Guides, will take their position before the main entrance of the Parliament Buildings. The Ottawa Centenary Choir of 1,000 voices will take up their position in front of the speakers' pavilion, while the thousands of children from the Ottawa and Hull schools and from other schools in the neighborhood of the

Capital, will be massed on the lawn on either side of the pavilion. The ceremony will open with an address by the Governor General, followed by the reading by Sir Lomer Gouin, president of the National Committee, of the Diamond Jubilee resolution passed by Parliament, and of extracts from addresses by certain Fathers of Confederation, prophetic of the present. "O Canada" will then be played and sung by the bands and massed choir, and the children, after which Miss Margaret Anglin, famous Canadian actress, will recite a patriotic ode. After the singing of the Maple Leaf, addresses will be delivered by Hon. L. P. D. Tilley, and by Hon. Thomas Chapais, representing the surviving sons and daughters of the Fathers of Confederation.

LEADERS TO SPEAK

"A Song of Canada" will then be sung, which will be followed by addresses by Rt. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, Premier of the Dominion, and by Hon. Hugh Guthrie, leader of the official Conservative opposition. Interspersed among other song numbers including "Land of My Heart's Adoration," "Vive la Canadienne," and "Land of Hope and Glory" will be addresses by Hon. Senator Raoul Dandurand, leader of the Government in the Upper Chamber, and former President of the League of Nations, and by Rt. Hon. George P. Graham, Chairman of the National Committee, and veteran in public life. Then will be sung God Save the King, and their Excellencies will leave with escort for Government House. The carillon on the Peace Tower will, for the space of fifteen minutes, repeat the musical numbers of the above program and during this time Premier King, accompanied by members of the cabinet and officers of the National Committee, will place wreaths, on behalf of the Canadian people, on the monuments of Queen Victoria, Cartier, Mackenzie, Brown, McGee, Baldwin, Lafontaine, and Macdonald.

It is to be noted that the bells at noon will be broadcasted internationally, as will also be the program which commences at 2.45.

HISTORICAL PAGEANT

At 5.30 there will be a historical pageant parade, for which elaborate preparations have been made. This will start at the corner of Wellington and Booth Streets, will cross the Chaudiere Bridge to Hull, proceed through Main Street, and cross the Interprovincial Bridge to St. Patrick and Rideau Streets, thence to Wellington, and to Parliament Hill, arriving at the main door of the Parliament Buildings at 7.15 p.m. It will then proceed via Bank Street, and reach Lansdowne Park at 8 o'clock.

At 7.30 p.m. there will be an official dinner in the Railway Committee Room of the House of Commons. At 9.30 there will be the unveiling of a tablet commemorating the Diamond Jubilee gift of Canadians in the United States to the people of Canada. Dr. W. W. Colpitts, President of the Canadian Club of New York, will perform the ceremony.

At 10.30 the carillon will again thunder forth with a program of patriotic airs. From 10.45 p.m. until after midnight the National Radio program will be broadcasted throughout Canada. This will include the addresses delivered at the afternoon ceremony. It will also include such well-known Canadian artists as Miss Margaret Anglin, Miss Eva Gauthier, Mr. Allan McQuhane, the Hart House Quartet, and Charles Marchand's
