BRITISH COLUMBIA PILOTAGE AUTHORITY

Application from qualified persons to enter the Pilotage Service in the British Columbia Pilotage District are invited by the Department of Transport, conditional on the applicant being able to pass an examination on pilotage and related subjects.

Qualifications Required

Applicant must be a Canadian citizen, resident in Canada, between the ages of 30 and 50, of good character and habits, and with a good record of service at sea. A certificate of health, eyesight and hearing must accompany application. A certificate of Competency of a grade not lower than Master, Tugboat Home Trade, with proof of at least three years' service as Master, or not less than one year's service as Master and for the balance of the qualifying period above mentioned double service as Chief Officer or First Mate in a vessel required by the Canada Shipping Act to carry a certificated mate, this service to be performed in a vessel engaged in the coastal trade of British Columbia (Certificate of Competency and testimonials must not accompany application).

Applications for examination must be in the hands of the Superintendent of Pilots, Federal Building, Vancouver, B.C., not later than December 8, 1952. An examination will be held on or about December 15, 1952, for establishing an eligible list from which, as necessary, appointments of probationary pilots for the District will be made.



HOLLYWOOD (AP) - The long and successful association' of John Wayne and Republic Studios has apparently hit the rocks.

Wayne, top man at the box office for the last two years, indicates that he has come to an impasse with his old friend and boss, Herbert Yates, head of Republic. If their falling out becomes permanent it will mean the end of a picture-making partnership that goes back to the early days of Wayne's 20year acting career.

The actor confirmed the rift on the set of "Alma Mater," which he is making for Warner Brothers.

"Yates will have to make me a darned good offer to get me to make another picture with him," Wayne said. "I'm fed up."

He said difficulties with Yates arose over the proposed filming of "The Alamo," a story of Texas' fight for independence. The picture was originally scheduled to be made under the banner of Wayne's own production company for Republic 528-3rd Ave., Prince Rupert, B.C.

"Yates said that I should give said. "He said I owed it to Reclaims that Yates told Texans! that the film would be shot in their state.

"But it would cost \$1,000,000 more to shoot it in Texas, instead of Latin America," said Wayne. "So when plans were changed the Texans got up in arms. Yates sent me down there to square things, which I did. Then I found a Panama location myself."




