FEW WOMEN IN CIVIC OFFICES

WINNIPEG FREE PRESS COMMENTS ON PAUCITY OF FEMALE CANDIDATES—WOMEN BE GOOD SCHOOL TRUSTEES

LONDON, Ont., Feb. 7.—(By Canadian Press.)—An editorial in the Free Press says: "The municipal elections just completed in Western Ontario show no great change with respect to the number of women candidates for office, or the proportion thereof elected. It cannot be said that they stand aside in deference to the number of ambitious men candidates, for in the late election, as in those of every year, there have been insufficient nominations in numerous municipalities, necessitating a second election. But there seems to be a disinclination on the part of the electors, including women voters themselves, to depart from customs. There have been noteworthy exceptions, of course, as in the case of Mrs. E. P. Twidale, who served on the City Council of Niagara Falls, and there will be others from time to time, no doubt.

On the other hand, woman's home interests connect up normally with those of education, and it is a little surprising that women school trustees are so few. There is evidently little or no opposition upon principle, to the election and their services are apparently satisfactory, for those who continue in office achieve the chairmanship. Windsor board has chosen Mrs. L. A. Kilien as chairman for 1927, and there is another woman trustee on the same body. A woman has been elected by acclamation to the board at Exeter. Mrs. J. I. A. Hunt is entering upon her third term in London. St. Thomas in recent years has had a woman trustee, and at present there are two. At Guelph, Mrs. C. R. Crowe, head of last year's board, and the first woman to serve thereon, has been defeated, along with another woman candidate, but this is not necessarily significant, in view of the large number of 1926 aldermen and trustees who shared that fate in the recent elections.

It is probable that a great majority of women, while interested in classroom work, with which they come in direct touch through the children, and where, incidentally, a majority of the staff are female teachers, concern themselves much less with general administration. One reads that at a London Township school section meeting to which ladies had been especially invited, only one was present. In the legislatures of Ontario, which frames the school laws, there is not one woman member, and there were but two women candidates at the late election.

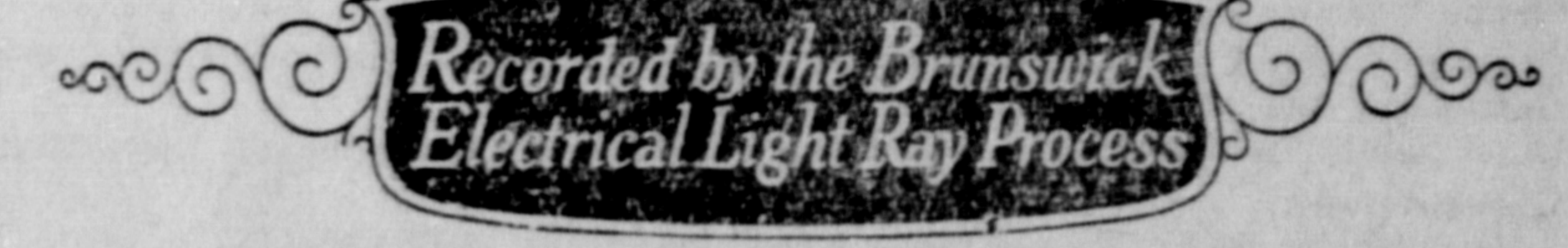
