

NEWSPAPER WHICH CITES SIM-HAR SEASON IN 1920

The Edmonton Journal in an optimisic editorial article says:

Much concern is being expressed, both privately and the newspapers, over the delayed seeding. It is feared that means a large reduction in the wheat creage and the serious impairment of the prospects of a good yield. But the experience of other years when the spring has been slow in arriving shows that there is little cause for such alarm. The present season has been very similar to that of 1920 and what happened in that year in this part of the province is worth citing. The winter had set in unusually early, like that just over, and May was well advanced before relief came. The feed situation was acute and the prophets of gloom were much more vocal than they have been in recent weeks. On May 10 this paragraph appeared in the Journal:

"Lost, a young lady, Miss Spring. Should have reached the city a month ago. Known to have been kept in durance vile by an old man called Winter. Feared that Winter has regained control of her."

A crop report was published by the provincial government on May 17. It told of the backwardness of seeding all through central Alberta, but held out hope that that of wheat would be completed in four or five days.
