"In the same article the writer desas an extraordinary condition agreement that the development of the Bush property purchased by the Sebakwe Company should be in charge of a mining engineer acceptable to the minority interest, that is, the vendors, and he appears to infer that this condition might confer upon the minority interest the control of the spending of money and control of news issued from the property. Surely it is not intended to suggest that the engineer in charge was giving, or would give, information to others than the head office of the company?

"The writer of the article cannot have followed the long and tedious history of B.C. Silver from 1919 onwards and the controversies which have cenupon it, or it would have been apparent to him that the reason for this condition was nothing of the sort to above, but was simply due to the dissatisfaction which the minshareholders in British Columbia or wrongly felt in regard to past development of B.C. Silver.
