Mr. Abel Flubs Six Spades,  
Could Have Made Seven

"Down one at six and you could have made seven," said Mr. Champion disgustedly, after Mr. Abel had flubbed his six spade contract. Do you think Mr. Champion was exaggerating in saying that seven-odd was possible?

This is how the play developed. Mrs. Keen led the six of clubs and dummy's king won. Mr. Abel saw that he had a possible loser in each of the red suits. If Mr. Masters had the queen of hearts, finessing the jack would insure the taking of twelve tricks.

If Mr. Masters held the queen of hearts with exactly two others, the suit would break and on the fourth lead of hearts dummy's small diamond could be discarded. In this case Mr. Abel would win all the tricks.

With these thoughts in mind, Mr. Abel took three rounds of trumps. Then he laid down the ace of hearts, in case Mrs. Keen had the lone queen. Next he entered dummy with the ace of diamonds, returned a heart and finessed the jack. When this lost to the lone queen, the contract was doomed as there was no way to avoid the loss of a diamond trick.

Mr. Champion hit the ceiling. "Didn't you ever hear of a safety play, man?" he belted. "I tried to play it safe," Mr. Abel replied. "I cashed the ace of hearts first in case someone had a lone queen."

"That's not enough," snapped Mr. Champion. "Why be half safe. Lay down the king, too, and you drop the queen."

"But what if Masters had three or four to the queen?" argued Mr. Abel. "So what?" Mr. Champion retorted. "After cashing your ace and king, go to dummy and lead a heart toward your jack. Your jack will win either the third or fourth round of the suit. If you had played your two top hearts you'd have made seven. You cash your ace of clubs next, then lead your last spade. Win in dummy and lead dummy's last spade. Masters would have been squeezed. He couldn't hold two hearts to prevent you from winning with both the jack and trey, and also hold three diamonds. If he threw a diamond on the last spade, all three of dummy's diamonds would have been good."
