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

Building Fine Boat for Himself in Interior For Use on Northern Waterways

Harvey D. Scott, who resides on the Parsnip river, about 34 miles this side of Finlay Forks, is working on the most complete pleasure boat which has been seen in this neighborhood. Scott has been trapping for several years in the north and has reached the time of life when he considers he should have some rational recreation. Lack of roads puts the automobile out of the question. so Scott hit upon designing and building a pleasure boat which will enable! him to get over the great waterways of the north with the maximum of comfort and enjoyment. For two months he has been engaged in the building, and by the middle of the month he will have the craft ready for launching. He says the building has been a pleasure stunt, and he aims to have everything on the craft that can be found on an automobile except balloon tires, and he may even add them yet to serve as life preservers.

The boat has a length overall of 28 feet, with a beam of 7 feet 6 inches, and is flat bottomed. The boat has a Scripps F-4 marine engine, which at 500 revolutions develops 15 h.p., but which can be speeded up to 2600 revolutions, giving 70 h.p. As an auxiliary power to be used in shallow water, Scott will have an aerial thrust drive, operated with a sprocket from the engine. Just what power this will give him the engineers have not informed him, but he is satisfied it will be sufficient for all purposes.

Scott will continue trapping in the winter months, but in the summer he intends to make extensive cruises. Next season he plans making a trip to the mouth of the MacKenzie river, for with every comfort. He expects to usual. launch the boat at Summit lake during the latter part of the month. Aside from his own labor the boat will cost him approximately \$2500.
