Several Charges of False Pretences Against Former Station Agent at Clairmont

EDMONTON, Oct. 24.-An extensive scheme of fraud in which cash, grain and property amounting to several thousands of dollars was involved, has been laid bare by the arrest of Paul Carl Paulson, alias Roy L. Turner, for 12 days station agent at Clairmont, and Mark Weston, alleged "outside man" in the fraud.

Brought from Calgary, Weston faced several charges of false pretences before Inspector Piper, A.P.P., and was remanded for one week. Gorden E. Wink-

ler appeared for the defence. Identification of the accused proved of the greatest difficulty but since the arrest of Weston in Calgary Saturday night and Paulson in Edmonton at the same time, all doubt is alleged to have been removed. Paulson was arraigned before Inspector Piper on several charges of conversion and theft and was remanded for one week.

SERIOUS SHORTAGE SHOWN

Paulson was engaged in Edmonton on September 26 and went to his station at once under the name of Turner and his disappearance on October 9 brought about a checkup of records that showed serious shortages. As Canadian National express agent he had access to numerous C.O.D. parcels of merchandise ordered from Edmonton merchants under ficticious names and these were missing, as well as 14 travellers' checks worth \$700. A book of 40 express order lanks was also gone.

Weston, it is alleged, cashed at least 26 express orders in Edmonton last week and at the King Edward Hotel where he had registered. C.N.R. and A.P.P. detectives who were on his trail were just five minutes behind him. When arrested he had \$1,700 in cash on

TRIED TO SELL GRAIN

When arrested Weston was attempting to sell two carloads of grain shipped out of Clairmont to the Malden Grain Company in Calgary for cash, on what the police said were "faked" bills of lading. On his person besides the cash were money order receipts, suggesting that some funds had been sent to




