**MYSTERY WHEAT IS DESCRIBED**

**Herman Trulle is Busy Man Answering Queries Regard to Grain**

WEMBLEY, Alta., Oct. 1.—Herman Trulle, world's wheat and oat king, has told at last the history and hopes of his new "Mystery Wheat" which, it is claimed, equals the best wheat now known and has the great advantage of ripening some fifteen to eighteen days earlier.

Mystery wheat is not yet ready for the world. Trulle is still developing it on his farm near here.

Mr. Trulle is a tired man; in fact, a wearied man. This is not to be wondered at when one considers that he is compelled to sit up, night after night, and burn the midnight oil in order to answer the numerous letters arriving in every mail. Never a day goes by that he is not interrupted in his work by visitors and called upon to answer a multiplicity of questions. Fame has its reward, but also its trials.

**THE "MYSTERY" PLOT**

On Mr. Trulle's farm the grain was cut and in the stack, ready for the thrasher, with the exception of one plot which was still standing, although it looked as though it should have been cut days before, as it seemed to be dead ripe.

"Why is this wheat not cut?" the newspaperman inquired.

"This is some of the wheat christened 'The Mystery Wheat' by one of Dr. King's party on the occasion of his visit last summer to our farm. Up to the present I have made no attempts to name it," replied Mr. Trulle.

He then proceeded to give his reasons for leaving the wheat standing: "My conception of a real combine wheat is one that is early and has a straw that is strong enough to hold up a head of grain that is reasonably non-shattering and will withstand all the varied weather and storm conditions through the growing period in the district to which you wish to adapt it. The vital period, from the combine standpoint, is from the time the head of wheat is ready to cut until it is dead ripe. By that I mean this wheat ripening so much earlier almost eliminates the danger from frost that would seriously damage Marquis just before it is ready to cut.

"The problem is to develop a wheat that will harden in the straw and reduce its moisture content sufficiently to permit of first-class marketing.

**BABE RUTH IS DUE WEDNESDAY**

**Takes Leading Part in Picture "Babe Comes Home" at Westholme**

Baltimore, Maryland, now proudly calls George Herman "Babe" Ruth its most renowned native son, but a score of years ago its citizenry failed to appreciate his madcap antics. Eastsiders voted this overgrown urchin and his gang tickets to St. Mary's Industrial school and therefore deserve credit for starting a career which today is beheld as the most colorful on the horizon of American notables.

"Babe Ruth's ascension to the pinnacle of fame in his chosen professional baseball career has served merely as a medium to popularize him as the greatest attraction in the varied field of entertainment. Unlike heroes of sport who preceded him on the field of glory, Ruth started his spectacular achievements where the others concluded.

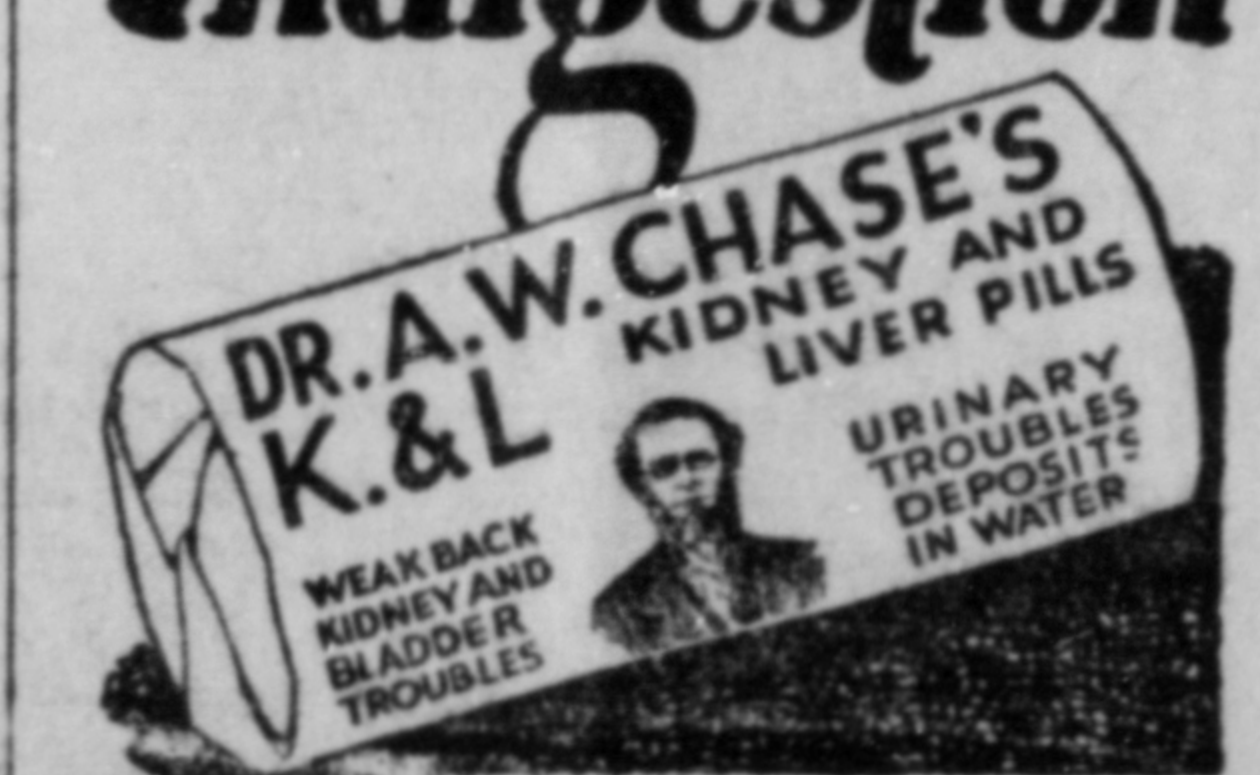
**25 CHINESE GIRLS IN WEEK-END PLAY**

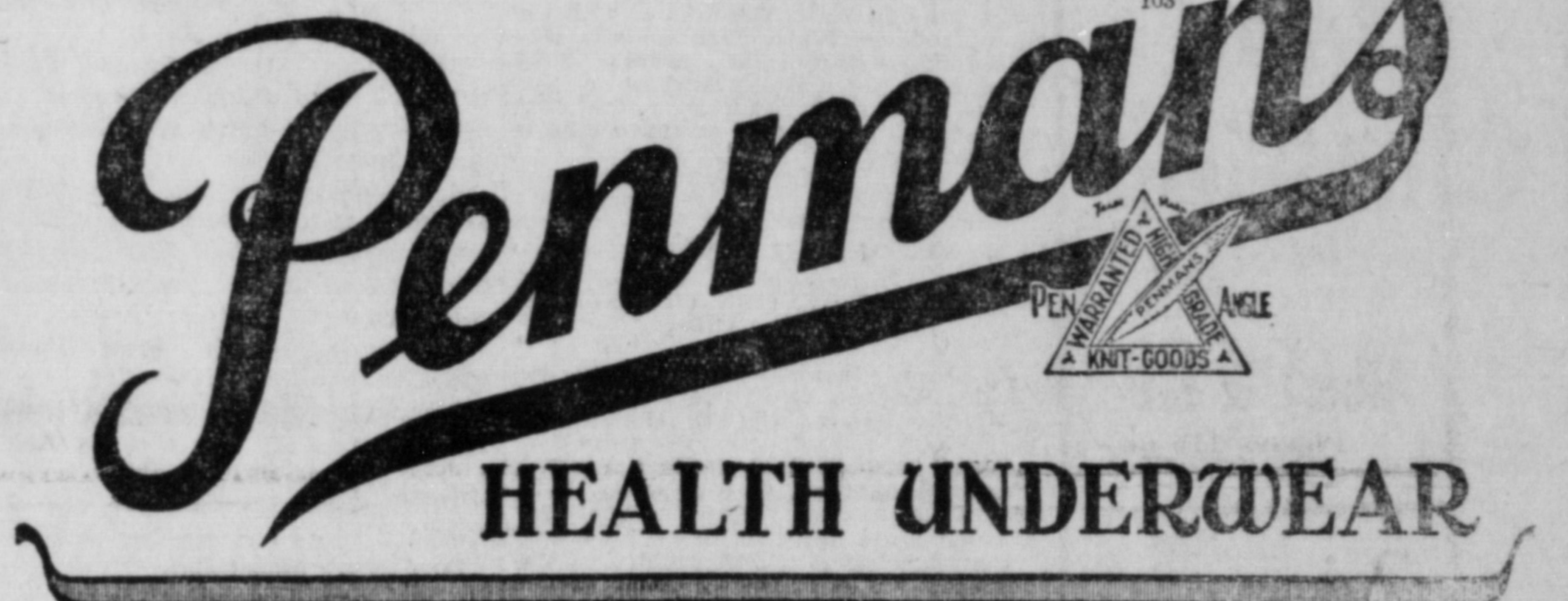
