**ALICE ARM LOOKS WELL** Excellent Results Being Obtained in Shafts Sunk by Silver Crest

The ore shows white quartz, through which is disseminated galena, chalcopyrite, zinc and iron pyrites. A vein four feet wide was partially opened up by open cut last fall, and assays are said to have run from \$12 to \$57 in gold, silver and copper. This summer a larger vein, apparently 15 feet wide, was discovered but no assays from it have yet been obtained. A trail has been cut through to the property and a pack train taken in to it without difficulty.
