

ANNUAL REPORT RECEIVED AT REG-ULAR MONTHLY MEETING LAST NIGHT

The regular monthly meeting of the library Board was held last evening in the library with Mrs. W. J. Kirkpatrick in the chair. Others present included tev. G. G. Hacker, James Black, Ald. W. Miss A. D. Cruickshank.

Miss Cruickshank reported 3547 books loaned during December, a daily average of 168.9. Forty new borrowers registered making 2,362 active borrowers. Eleven books were received by gift and 73 by purchase. Thirteen were withdrawn, being worn out, thus making 5,576 books on the shelves and in circu-

The report for the year's work was received showing satisfactory increases

all around. Mrs. W. J. Kirkpatrick thanked the nembers of the board for their loyal support during the year and also thanked Miss Cruickshank for the keen interest displayed in her work as librarian.
