## LONE EAGLE IS SAFE IN MEXICO AFTER ARDUOUS FLIGHT

### Russians Are Arrested in Canton and Executed; Passports Given Consul

Soviet Emissaries Paraded Through Streets of City Before Being Given Their Quietus by Nationalists

CANTON, December 15 .- The Nationalist government today arrested thirteen Russians alleged to be responsible for the recent Communist uprising and shot three of them. The others were paraded through the streets so that the people of the city might see NEW SNOW AND their degregation and they were executed later.

SHANGHAI, December 15 .- The Nationalist government today handed the Soviet Consul his passports, this being in line with the recently announced policy of removing Russian influence in Chinese affairs. The Nationalists were ready to receive encouragement and advice from the Russians but very soon it was found that the Soviet representatives wanted to be dictators and this was resented.



### Thirty-One Girls Lose Lives as Fire Destroys Orphans' Home in Quebec

QUEBEC, December 15 .- Fire late last night destroyed the Hospice St. Charles conducted by Sisters of the Good Shepherd, the known death toll now standing at 31-all girls-with twenty-three children missing. The death list may reach fifty before a check-up is completed. Eleven of the victims have been identified. Three hundred and seventy-one children were in the institution. Suffocation accounted for the most of the deaths.

Various rescues were made. Many children jumped to the streets while others dragged their companions out. The east wing of the building is a heap of ruins while the new section is undamaged. Cries of those trapped were heard through the flames. Most of the children were orphans with their fathers or mothers dead or their parents too poor to care for them.

Rose Anna Gouldreault, aged 17, an employee in the babies' ward, died on making her fourth entry into the dormitory to rescue children.
