### SPORT CHAT

So far good weather has favored the activities of the local outdoor sports organizations. The season is now well under way and, unlike the most of past springs, it has not been necessary to postpone or call off a single fixture on account of the unkindness of the elements. It is to be hoped that conditions will continue to be as favorable. If the football and baseball associations would take a word from the wise, it might be suggested to them that they have the games start on time which they have not been doing. Fans are not encouraged to continue their patronage when they have to wait around anywhere from 15 minutes to three-quarters of an hour for a game to start after the scheduled hour. Later in the season, as the evening's begin to shorten, and they will be doing that before long now, the necessity of more punctuality will be fully apparent.
