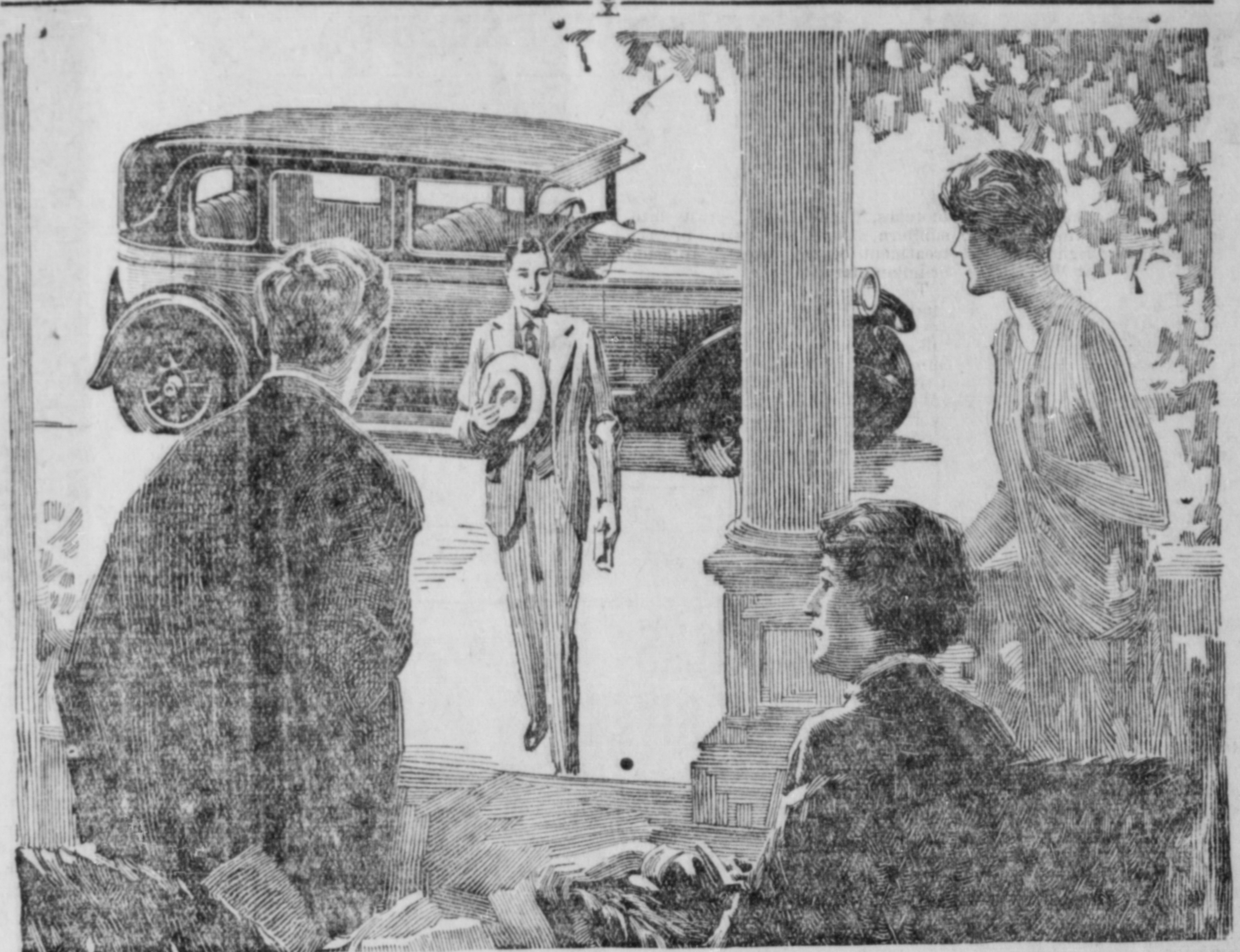

Rose, Cowan & Latta, presenting the lower tender of \$208, was awarded the contract by the city council last night for the printing of 100 copies of the 1928 voters' list. Alex McRae Co. bid \$285 plus four per cent sales tax.

On recommendation of the utilities committee, the city council last night gave Albert & McCaffery Ltd. the order for 500 tons of Nanaimo-Wellington washed pea coal for use in the dry dock power plant. The bid was \$7.50 per long ton f.o.b. dry dock.

During the month of November the city electric light department showed a surplus of \$1,490.42 and the telephone department a surplus of \$795.68 according to reports presented to the city council last night by J. J. Little, superintendent of utilities. There was no report in regard to the loss on the water.

Robert Mathison, half-breed, was fined \$25, with the option of thirty days' imprisonment, in city police court this morning for drunkenness. Andrew Cecil and Andrew Moffatt, Indians, were each fined \$15 and \$3.50 costs, with the option of thirty days' imprisonment, on similar charges. Asked where he obtained the liquor, Moffatt stated that he had paid a man at Cow Bay who was about to have to trap-ping \$4 for a bottle.

The next meeting of the city council will be on Thursday, December 29, the city fathers decided last night. It will be the week between Christmas and New Year's during which there are a number of other events on.

The city council last night deferred for another two weeks the consideration of amendments to the street traffic by-law. Ald. G. P. Tinker and Ald. Jos. Greer pointed out that the matter had been hanging fire for some time and urged that it be dealt with as soon as possible.

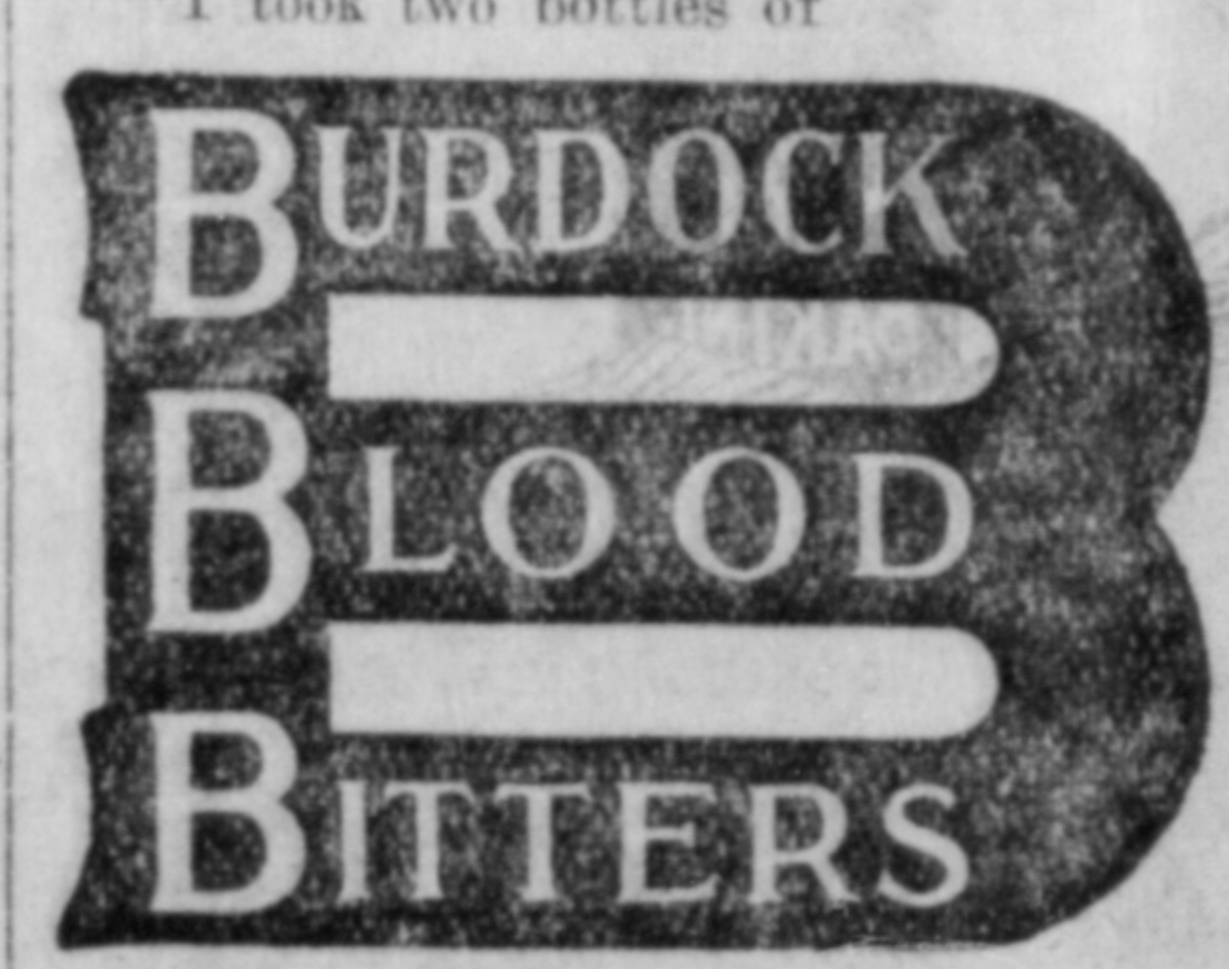
