to work out a scheme. Conditions had changed and conservation was necessary. They should not be asked to shut down in the middle of the season and to avoid that this plan had been brought forth.

W. Montgomery spoke at some length as a citizen and not as a fisherman. He took exception to the idea that the fish belonged to the canneries but said they belonged to all the people. He objected to the fishermen being forced to sell to the canneries in the area in which the fish were caught. He thought it was not a matter for the fishermen or the canners to arrange a plan but for the department to make the regulations.

SEINERS OBJECT

J. R. Arnold stated that he had been asked by the seining men to state that the scheme set forth was detrimental to them as it would tend to keep prices down. They advocated the use of larger nets and no fishing in or near the creeks. They considered the area system would jeopardize their living.

James Field explained the difficulty they would have on Queen Charlottes if the area system was adhered to. They would have to take what price the canners liked to pay. He believed in conservation but he believed in destroying the natural enemies of the fish.

The meeting then closed after Mr. Found had expressed the hope that they would come to agreement on the question.
