Farm Products Sent Out of Province Valued at \$8,408,638 in Year 1926

Very materially exceeding the figure given in preliminary estimates, the report of the statistician of the department agriculture, C. H. Stewart, made publi by Hon. E. D. Barrow, shows that the total agricultural production of the province for the year 1926 was valued a \$71,362,209, an increase of \$6,208,696 over the year 1925 or 9.53 per cent.

As an offset to the increased value of importations, a satisfactory feature of agricultural production is the large in crease shown in the value of exports. is estimated that the total value of exports for the year amounted to \$8,406,-638, this being an increase of \$1,676,929, or 24.91 per cent.
