SNAP FUNCTIONS OF HUMAN BODY

SUCH IS THE OBJECTIVE OF THREE ENGLISH PHOTOGRAPHIC SCIENTISTS

LONDON, Jan. 15.—(By Canadian Press).—Three British scientists are hopeful of soon perfecting a discovery which will make possible the photographing of the function of the human organs. They believe they will be able to take pictures of the digestive organs at work, and photograph other parts of the internal machinery of man, which proceedings, while suggestive of a macabre inclination will be extremely valuable to medical science.

The three are Frederick Melville, radiologist at University College, London; E. W. Edwards, and E. Warnford, of British Instructional Films. The trio have already succeeded in photographing at the normal speed of the body, the movements of the limbs as seen by X-ray. This moving-picture X-ray places before medical men secrets of the human body never before tabulated. Hitherto, all X-ray photographs have been "still" pictures, and scientists all over Europe have been seeking for what the three Brits have now found.

The discovery is claimed by Edwards as a departure not only from cinematography but from X-ray science. "We have now arrived at a perfect system with regard to the photographing of the bones," he says, "but the ray which reveals the bones penetrates the tissues and in order to photograph the heart an
