REAT PREPARATIONS FOR THE BAN-QUET IN HONOR OF THE RETIR-ING LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR OF ONTARIO

180 WAITERS

TORONTO, Jan. 15. - (By Canadian ress).--Over half an acre of canvas burlap spread over an equal area of carpet felting, tanbark and clay has been necessary to prepare the floor of the Coliseum for the colossal banquet to be given in honor of Col. Harry Cockshutt, retiring Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario. on Tuesday next.

The catering contract has been accepted by a large city firm. This occasion in the annals of Toronto banqueting history has only been equalled by the entertainment given to the Duke and Duchess of Connaught in the armories in 1916.

There will be required 150 quarts of fruit cocktail, 100 gallons of soup, 12 gallons of olives, 25 pounds of almonds, 4 cases of celery or 24 dozen heads, 2,-000 pounds of chicken or 500 four-pound birds, which if placed in a solemu lineal procession would extend for about five blocks; 16 bags of potatoes for potato croquets; 150 tins of peas and 15 bags of carrots for the compote of vegetable with white sauce, 200 quarts of frozen pudding, 75 quarts of vanilla sauce. Now to the question of trimmings and embellishments. It will take 2.000 orders of fruit, which is more or less an elusive estimation and consequently can only be held down by an approximation: this would be about 250 pounds of Jif grapes, together within the neighborhood of 200 pounds each of oranges, apples and bananas, 40 pounds of coffee: 10 gallons of cream, which would be the product of about 25 jersey cows: 70 pounds of sugar; 4,000 bread rolls, which if placed end to end would reach from

TOTAL CATCH 300,000 BARRELS As late as early December, an almost unprecedented date for mackerel catches of any size, 126,000 pounds taken off Highland Light were brought into Massachusetts ports. The total catch of the season is estimated at more than 300,000 barrels, far the blgsince the record season of 1885. After fair seasons in 1916 and 1917 there was a succession of lean years. In 1923 there was considerable improvement, with a catch of 125,000 barrels, but in 1925 it jumped to 216,000. Captains of some of the larger Portland schooners are planning to start early next spring and stick with the mackerel right through the year, in the hope of a repetition of this year's run. A veteran mackerel fisherman on the New Dawn scouts the idea that there is anything mysterious about the way the mackerel appear and disappear each season. "They stick around," he said, "until the feed gets scarce and then they begin to drop off. When it's all gone in the near shore they'll just go off into deep water like a good many other fish. Migh just as well call the swordfish or horse mackerel or dogfish mysterious. They show up at certain a season and they say good-bye about the same time every year."
