

In the course of their studies in household economy in an eastern university, four of the students decided to make a test of this for themselves. They visited a home consisting of five persons, the par-

ents and three small children, and actually did the weekly family wash, accomplishing the work complete in three hours, using a \$150 electric washing machine.

Being students of economic costs, they were careful to accumulate cost data and this is what the wash cost without any labor charge:

Deterioration of machine 50c Electric current 10c Water 05c Soap (actual cost) 10c Blueing 02c
