A good evening, a good game and a good crowd all contributed to a good evening's enjoyment at Acropolis Hill last evening when the Native Sons won over the Gyros ten to four in a senior baseball fixture.

Gyros led off with a couple of runs in the first and scored two more in the fifth, but the Sons with one in the first, four in the second, one in the third and four in the fifth were never in danger of defeat. At the end of the first of the fifth, the score was six to four in favor of the Sons, and a close finish was looked for but Gyros soared heavenward and by the time they calmed down they were too far behind.

Loblick pitched fine ball all through and was given good support. He never seemed in difficulty and when danger threatened was always able to get out of the hole easily.

The nearest piece of fielding was a one handed pickup by Downie in the seventh.

Downie's little speech at third in the last half of the fourth was cut short when Minahan nearly got him off the base with a fine throw. Downie in the fifth made a long hit that was just short of going over the hill. Lambie missed Haviland in the seventh from a long fly and a double play Loblick to Wendell to Menzies finished the game.

Haviland struck out seven and walked five. Loblick struck out eight and walked three. The Sons had four errors, the Gyros seven. Gyros made four hits, Haviland making a two-bagger. Sons had ten hits, with Downie a two-bagger.
