CONCRETE SIDEWALK IS PETITIONED FOR

Property Holders on North Side of
Third Avenue Between Sixth and
Seventh Streets Ask Improve-

The city council last night was in receipt of a petition from property owners concerned asking for the construction, under the local improvement plan, of a twelve foot concrete sidewalk on the north side of Third Avenue between Sixth and Seventh Streets. Those signing the petition included Cliff Ford, H. G. Helgeson, Ltd., V. D. Casley, Mrs. Lottie Casley, Tom Shimizu, G. Nishikaze, L. Ross and J. A. Lindsay.
