### Waterfront Whiffs

Some Official Figures on Salmon Fisheries—Halibut Landings Excessively Light-Cedric Wrecked in North

With the season now almost ended, it is found from conpilation of official figures that the salmon pack for 1927 to date in District No. 2 stands at less than half of last year's (1926) pack at a similar date. For the whole district, according to latest available figures, the total now stands at 405,060 cases as compared with 858,411 cases at the same date last year. Only in two sections, Rivers Inlet and Smith's Inlet, are gains from last year to be reported and those are very slight. In the other parts, Naas River, Skeena River, Central Division, Bella Coola and Queen Charlotte Islands, the packs are hardly fifty per cent of last year. Coho\*-
